
improvements with 50% of the groups escaping!

## Year 12 and 13 Criminology

Year 12 Criminology students have completed their Unit 1 coursework, Campaigns for Change, which saw them explore a range of crimes and the impact they have on society, how individuals and charities campaign for changes in laws and justice, as well as creating their own campaign for change. At the beginning of Term 3, students embarked on their learning of Unit 2, Theories of Criminality. Students specifically look at the social constructions of criminality, exploring theories and causes of criminality and investigating policy changes.



Whilst completing their Unit 3 coursework, Crime Scene to Courtroom, Year 13 students have been exploring how criminal cases progress through the Criminal Justice System, which includes reviewing criminal cases. Students are now working towards Unit 4,

Crime and Punishment. Students will study how laws are created, made, and implemented, and the role the Criminal Justice System plays in society. This includes the measures taken to maintain social control.

## Year 13 Business Studies

Year 13 Business Studies students were given an amazing opportunity to find out about the Waitrose recruitment process when their HR Manager came in for the afternoon.



The purpose of this visit was for the students to examine the recruitment and selection process to support their

current unit of work. Students found out information on how to apply for a position, what a company looks for in an employee and lots more!

Presentations like this, and others that Brompton Academy provide - enables students to quickly gain substantial amounts of information in order to make their work life decisions easier.

#### Music Lessons

During Term 3, KS3 (key stage 3), students have been studying music from various genres and decades including Beat Music, Grime, EDM, Protest Music and Programme Music. Students have used music technology to create compositions, as well as various instruments, to compose and learn a variety of pieces which they have performed to their peers.





Year 10 and 11 GCSE Music students have been working hard to complete the course, with Year 11 also preparing for their performance exam in March. Miss Connor and Miss Fox have been so impressed with the rehearsals and are looking forward to seeing students showcase their hand work! Year 10 have been working on a variety of skills while completing Unit 201, which required them to complete an in-depth genre comparison and analysis of their chosen song.

Year 12 and 13 students have been working hard to complete a variety of units that have been tailored to their ideal careers in the industry. For Unit 349, Year 12 students recently had a guest lecture on careers in the industry delivered by LCCM, one of the top UK contemporary music institutions. Our Year 13 students have now all applied for universities, ranging from BIMM Institute to De Montfort University, to study a variety of courses such as Music Production, Songwriting, and Musicology. Good luck to all students awaiting their university offers!

Rock School has also been a very popular extracurricular activity, with students from both KS3 and KS4 attending, in which the students work in bands to perform a variety of songs. Our peripatetic music teachers have been extremely busy teaching students from all year groups and are thrilled with the fantastic progress students are making in their instrumental lessons!

The Academy Reward Shop is available during lunchtimes and students are able to purchase items from their ePraise accounts using their REACH points.

The ePraise app encourages students to make good financial decisions based on the level of REACH points that they have earned in their lessons. Students can exchange these tokens for either physical items from the Academy Reward Shop, such as confectionaries and treats, enter raffles for larger termly items, such as Apple AirPods, or donate a proportion of their points to a cash value for charity. We feel that by giving students these

options, we are again ensuring that the positive reinforcement and student responsibilities are being continuously developed. Students can also make suggestions for prizes and items they wish to see.




dedication! Well done to all students involved, who have received medals for their contributions to the event.



This term we embarked on expedition training - students have been learning navigation and how to read a map and route plan in their teams. They have also covered camp craft (building a camp), equipment and hygiene (what they need; walking boots, trangia, tent etc) along with menu planning.

The cooking sessions will run in Terms 4 and 5; videos will posted every Wednesday via Edmodo from the 23rd February 2022 until the 30th March, then again from the 20th April to the 25th May 2022. There will be 12 sessions in total.

There will be a small one-off fee of £10 per student, which will go towards the tutor costs. Students wishing to participate are required to sign up via ParentPay by Friday 18th February 2022. Payment towards the cooking sessions is non-refundable. By making payment via ParentPay, parents/carers are giving permission for their child to participate.
