Sport England's 'Unite the Movement Campaign'

A newly launched strategy by Sport England has highlighted Brompton Academy's Satellite Tennis Club as providing positive experiences for young people. The club run in partnership with Frindsbury Lawn Tennis Club has been identified as an example of good practice in providing young people with a highly positive experience of sport. The club has been held after school, sessions have taken an innovative, non-traditional way of delivering tennis to our students by having flexible rules, loud music playing and a turn up and play approach which has proved very popular.



Creating positive experiences for young people is one of five areas Sport England has highlighted in its brand new strategy titled 'Unite the Movement' which aims to get more people active, removing barriers to participation and levelling inequalities.

The Brompton Academy Satellite Tennis Club has benefitted from funding from Kent Sport and the tireless work of the coaches from Frindsbury Lawn Tennis Club. The sessions have been highly rated by the students attending and this club has also enabled sixth formers to train as tennis leaders to help volunteer at the sessions. The partnership

with Frindsbury Lawn Tennis Club continues online with new sessions being delivered by the coaches to Brompton Academy students.

We have found ourselves starting another new term, introducing ourselves to muted microphones and cartoon profile pictures. This isn't the way we would have liked to begin Term 3, BUT... the show must go on!

As a team we continue to be extremely impressed with the commitment and enthusiasm from all students and are grateful for all the amazing work that is being produced through this ever changing and uncertain time

Students are continuing to work extremely hard in their lessons and not letting home learning stop them! As a team we commend the resilience of all of our students; from Phase One through to Sixth Form.

Phase One have been looking at key skills in both Dance and Drama, through exploration of dance pieces and scripts as well as extended writing tasks and self-assessments.

Charlie - Year 7 Drama





This term saw the launch of our online Expedition challenges and activities to develop the skills needed on an expedition. Students were initially set a one pot cooking challenge; the aim was to produce a meal using only one pan and one burner to replicate cooking on a trangia.

We had so many fabulous entries, Kacee in Year 9 was the Bronze Award winner and Iona in Year 10 was the Silver Award winner at Brompton Academy. The DofE team also chose Florence from Year 9 at Brompton Academy as the overall UKAT winner! Well done to everyone who participated.

The Countryside Code quiz was the next activity, and the term has finished with the students being set a 5K walking challenge. The DofE team are looking forward to finding out how the

students get on when they return after the break. More challenges and activities will take place during Term 4, such as map reading, basic first aid and rucksack packing.

The Cooking elective which supports the Skill section for Bronze Award students will commence during the first week back of Term 4. This year it will be delivered fully online by our external tutor Mrs Malone, as the transition from onsite sessions to online films proved to be very successful during the first lockdown. Elements of Music

This term, students in Years 7-9 have been looking at the Elements of Music through composition on GarageBand. We have also explored music from around the world: Samba from Brazil, Djembe Drumming from West Africa and Reggae from Jamaica. We have discovered the descriptive Programme Music, Music for Film and explored genres such as Electronic Dance Music, Motown, Soul and Modern Pop.

Phase 2 - Rock School Ltd - RSL Level 2 Music Practitioners

Our RSL Level 2 students have been looking at and analysing songs such as Bohemian Rhapsody, War Pigs and Another Brick in The Wall (Part 2) and researching the history and etymology of 2 genres as part of their coursework.

Phase 3 - Rock School Ltd - RSL Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma for Music Practitioners

Students in Year 12 have been looking critically at themselves as musicians, and through a series of rehearsals have built up their skills to be strong musicians. Year 13 have been looking at, and preparing for an audition, in order to ready themselves for interviews (and auditions) at university and beyond.

New Level 2 (GCSE) Pathway

We are very excited to offer a new pathway to our Level 2 qualification. Students can now choose to focus on performance or production! We encourage students to speak to their Music teacher if you would like some more information.

At Brompton Academy we also offer a 30% subsidy towards the lesson fees.


