### Rutherford Mini School - Blue Zone Project

Rutherford Mini School students have been working together on a new project called Blue Zone. Blue Zone was founded by Dan Buettner (a Journalist and Researcher) who set out to find the longest-lived people on earth, and learn the secrets of their lifestyle. He wanted to know how people were living past 100 years in certain places in the world. Dan's research on what came to be known as the five 'Blue Zones' came from learning, studying, and living like those within the Blue Zone communities. The research/study focuses on the diet and lifestyle of these people with a correlation of results between the Blue Zones.

During the last term, Rutherford students have been discussing and exploring the following:

- Exploring their Blue Zone - Sardinia in Italy
- Trying fruit and vegetables in Mini School time
- Personal Development on sustainable eating
- Looking at recipes and types of foods
- Opportunity to grow and produce their own fruit and vegetables

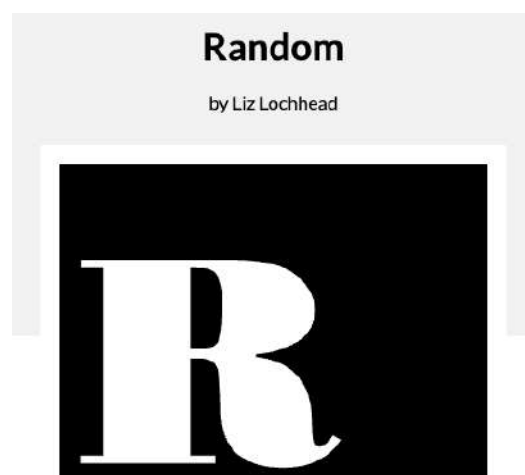

## Year 12 Performing Arts

## Careers Corner Term 4

The Career Hub has had a very busy term celebrating Careers Week (6th - 10th March 2023), National Science Week (10th - 19th March 2023), and International Women's Day (8th March 2023).

### February's CBNB

We have had another successful Careers Business Networking Breakfast meeting at the end of February, with three more fantastic businesspeople talking to students from Year 10 and Year 12. Our guests were from Uniper Energy (who work on decarbonising our energy production), Marlowe Theatre, and the NHS. All students were engaged with all the speakers, which was great to see!



### Women in Science Talks

On 8th March 2023 (International Women's Day), all students from Year 7, Year 8, Year 9 and Year 10 listened to two speakers, from the University of Kent, talk about what they did and how they made their career choices. The students asked some very thoughtful questions after each session.

Feedback from 257 students of the 1,000 or so who attended said that:

- 54% learnt a lot about career opportunities
- 63% said that it was interesting to hear what the scientists did and how they chose their career
- 15% agreed that the talks had changed their career plans

Additional comments made by students:

"I really liked and enjoyed the talk. I thought it was very interesting and I hope we do this again."

"It has helped me understand forensic science more, as this is what I would like to do in the future."

"It was interesting to hear about the jobs and how they help cancer."

### Personal Tutor Time Career Activities

Every Thursday in March, the Personal Tutor activity has been dedicated to using Unifrog. This is a device that every student has on their iPads that enables them to explore career opportunities linked to their preferences.

This included a career challenge quiz competition (271 students entered), which recorded interest and personality profiles and explored what careers Unifrog suggest. It further recorded what careers are best suited to each student's work environment preferences and completed their skills profile.

## Career Business Networking Breakfast

On 24<sup>th</sup> March 2023, we saw our second Careers Business Networking Breakfast meeting of the term. 20 interested students from Year 10, Year 11, and Year 12 chatted over breakfast with businesspeople from Microsoft and GitHub, The National Grid from the Isle of Grain, and Creative media industries.



## X Lab in the Science Department

This term's X Lab has been all about Electricity and Climate Change. In these extra-curricular Science activities, the students explored the Science, career opportunities, and the creative modelling and expression of two subjects.



Year 7 and Year 9 students worked on a project called 'Creative Climate Change Awareness'.

The final part of the week's project was to create animations and video recordings persuading and encouraging people to reduce their carbon footprint.

## UKAT Governing Board Reshuffle

It has been a busy term for our UKAT Governing Body, with tours of Brompton Academy (BA) and strategic planning days. Members, Trustees, and Governors alike have been spending time with staff and touring the Academy.

Below is an introduction to Alex Martin-Carey, who is one of our Governors:

As a Governor, my role is to work with the rest of the Board to ensure that the Academy is doing its best for the students, and meeting its obligations and requirements. This means that we meet regularly (at least six times a year) to discuss a wide range of issues and provide challenge to the Senior Leadership Team. We receive reports from the Academy Principal and other Senior Leaders covering the full range of activities in the Academy – everything from how students are performing in their subject assessments, to outcomes of

Mini School competitions, or updates required to the Academy site and its buildings. When we can, we try to see what goes on in the Academy day to day. Sometimes that means observing lessons, or eating lunch in the Academy Refectory, or attending performances and events. The Governors report to the UKAT Trustees, who are responsible for overseeing the whole of UKAT.

The teachers are of course the experts in the classroom, but our role is strategic and to challenge the Academy Leaders to make sure that they are making the best choices they can in the interest of all students. We bring a wide range of expertise; some of us have worked in education, but others come from a variety of industries or sectors. There are two current BA parents and one current BA staff member on the Board, too. Bringing all these different experiences together means that we sometimes have very different views, but that discussion and debate is a healthy part of making difficult decisions. Several of the Governors are linked to particular areas of the Academy – I am the Careers Governor, which means that I work closely with the Careers Team in the Academy. I meet with them regularly to discuss their plans and what has taken place, I attend events, and offer advice.

Every Academy has challenges, and I do think that diverse and committed Governors and Trustees at BA play a key role in helping leaders to address those challenges. Although I have spent lots of time at the Academy through my role at the University, it's been great to get to know the Academy in this new way over the last year. Being a Governor makes me think hard, often considering things from a new perspective, but it's also a chance to use my experience to support others in a different way. I have even more respect now for the hard work that goes on behind the scenes to keep the Academy running and am often bowled over by the achievements of staff and students.
