Box Clever Romeo and Juliet Performance

On Wednesday 3rd May 2023, the English Department invited Year 10 and Year 11 students to watch an adaptation of Romeo and Juliet, performed by Box Clever Theatre Company.

The actors used an edited version of the play along with lights, music, and audience participation to present their take on Shakespeare's classic play. They presented their version of the play in just over an hour. Our students were then invited to take to the stage and gave a truly dramatic performance. Many students were keen to take part in the workshops.



After being taught some Shakespearian insults and directed how to deliver their lines for maximum impact, the students took to the stage much to the delight of their peers. Matthew from Year 10 told us that "The play was modernised with media and terminology used in today's modern world which made the play more engaging, which I really liked!" The play was enjoyed by both audiences, and the English Department hope to host Box Clever again in the future.



World Scout Jamboree in Korea

Silas, Year 10 student, has been chosen to represent the UK at this year's World Scout Jamboree in Korea. As one of seven Scouts from the Medway Towns and 108 Scouts from Kent, Silas will join over 50,000 young people aged 14-17 years from nearly every country in the world!

The World Scout Jamboree is an educational festival that takes place every four years in different countries worldwide. It is an opportunity for cultural exchange and adventure, with activities designed to encourage young people to become active citizens and take positive action on global issues such as





peace, the environment, and sustainable development. Silas underwent a rigorous selection process at a weekend camp, where he was assessed on various criteria including communication skills, resilience, positive attitude and teamwork. Since then, he has attended seven training camps to prepare for this unique experience.

In addition to his training, Silas has been actively fundraising for his trip, which costs £4,000, with a portion of the funds going towards subsidising attendance for Scouts from less economically developed countries.

Woolf Mini School - Blue Zone Project



Woolf Mini School students have been working together on a new project called Blue Zone. Blue Zone was founded by Dan Buettner (a journalist and researcher), set out to find the longest-lived people on earth and learn the secrets of their lifestyle. He wanted to know how people were living past 100 years in certain places of the world. His research on what came to be known as the five 'Blue Zones' came from learning, studying, and living like those within the Blue Zone communities. The research/study focuses on the diet and lifestyle of these people with a correlation of results between the Blue Zones.

During Term 5, students in Woolf Mini School have been discussing and exploring the following:

- Exploring their Blue Zone Loma Linda Greece.
- Trying fruits and vegetables in Mini School time.
- Personal development on sustainable eating.
- Looking at recipes and types of foods.
- Taking time to take part in activities outside during Mini School.

Students loved trying fruit and food from Greece during the second week of term. Students sampled figs, apricots, tzatziki, cherries and olives. It was great to see students trying foods outside of their comfort zone and staff joining in on the fun! Students have shown real maturity and aspiration to learn about their chosen country and are currently producing ideas towards how they can represent Greece.



Personal and Professional Development

Understanding the importance of positive and healthy relationships is essential for our student's wellbeing, and this has been our focus within Personal and Professional Development (PPD).

There has been some coverage in the news about Relationships and Sex Education in schools recently, so we wanted to share with you how we deliver these topics at the Academy. Firstly, our curriculum is planned carefully to ensure that it is age appropriate and progressively builds students knowledge of topics. We use quality assured resources from the PSHE Association and Medway Health, which are adapted to the needs and abilities of our classes. Staff receive training in best practice and safeguarding. When discussing sensitive topics, we aim to create a safe learning environment with clear ground rules for respectful discussions to take place.

Year 7 students have been learning about the physical and emotional changes that occur during puberty, and how to make healthy lifestyle choices to support these changes.





Year 8 have been exploring relationship values and expectations.

Year 9 students have been learning about relationships, sexual reproduction, and health with a particular focus on the law, consent, and how to stay safe.

Year 10 have been exploring issues around self-esteem and how to build self-confidence.


