Although eventual winners, Rainham Mark, proved too strong, Brompton Academy finished the group in second place and went through to play for the bronze medal. This match took place against Thomas Aveling and was a very exciting game, with Thomas Aveling narrowly winning to claim the bronze medal. The Academy finished in fourth place out of eight schools.

Overall, it was an excellent days cricket, with our students showing high levels of team work, individual skills, and good sportsmanship.

On Tuesday 20th June 2023, a combined Year 9 and Year 10 team took to the field to play Sir Joseph Williams Maths School B team. This was the first time that a Brompton Academy team had played hard ball cricket. The team won the toss and elected to bowl first, and under Captain Felix, restricted the Maths School to 104 from their 15 overs.

With some excellent bowling from Joel, Dawud, and Felix, the team gained confidence in their fielding and took some really good catches. Wicketkeeper Romeo was also in fine form behind the stumps, communicating with his team to great effect. As Brompton Academy commenced their run chase, there was some fantastic hitting from Felix and Dawud to get to the scoreboard, moving towards the total required to win.

Brompton Academy batted exceptionally well, and managed to hit the winning runs with two overs to spare thanks to Alfie and Romeo. Player of the match was Dawud for his wicket taking bowling and excellent batting.

The team represented the Academy to their finest ability, showing respect to the opposition, and playing the game in the right spirit.

Secondary School Games District Athletics

We invited over 28 employers and training providers to attend, and the students were interacting with all of them, asking questions, finding out about the different career options available to them, as well as different college and university courses.

The Careers Fair was a fantastic opportunity for all year groups, and the employers' feedback has been so positive, complimenting the students on their impeccable behaviour.



Our Year 10 and Year 12 students also had the pleasure to talk with a Veterinary Surgeon, who spoke about university applications and life working as a vet. The students gained so much useful information from the talk to help them with their next academic journey.



Nature Grant Success!

Brompton Academy has been successful in applying for a Local School Nature Grant to support the Gardening Club.

The grant is open to schools and early years settings in England, Scotland, and Wales. This outdoor learning grant fund has two elements – £500 of outdoor equipment chosen from a catalogue of over 100 items, and an outdoor learning training course for our staff.

Jennifer Pound and James Whitehead worked together on the application and were successful in the latest round. We have been awarded the equipment below which will benefit all our students to increase the bio-diversity at the Academy.

The Gardening Club is also run within the Eliot Centre Garden and the equipment below will allow this to grow.

The Easi-Scope cameras will be used by various departments to study close up images. The Wildlife camera will be used to map and chart activity across the site and the data can be used within the Maths Department for practical lessons. The seeds will be planted within our nature pockets and will self-seed, year after year, supporting the bio-diversity of the site.

We also have two hours of training on Gardening for Biodiversity, which will be arranged with all those involved in the Gardening Club. This training module will give us some practical tips for getting going and will include content around growing, nurturing, harvesting and eating produce we have grown.
