Brompton Academy had a fantastic start to the festive season at our annual Christmas Activity Event held on Saturday 30th November.


Seventy-five parents, carers, students and members of the wider community joined us in celebrating Christmas by taking part in three Christmas themed workshops (baking, card and craft making).

Brompton Academy Science Department Goes Crystalline

Phase Two Challenge: Crystals



This term Years 9 and 10 took part in the first Phase Two Challenge. This challenge was all about making copper sulphate (CuSO₄) crystals.

The first part of the Phase Two Challenge was inspired by artist Roger Hiorns who filled an entire bedsit apartment with CuSO₄ solution and allowed the crystals to grow on the walls, ceiling, floor and furniture.







The installation is now in the Yorkshire Sculpture Park.

All Year 9 and 10 classes designed and constructed their own mini-bedsit models and allowed the CuSO₄ crystals to grow in them.

The second part of the challenge was to extract a CuSO₄ solution from an insoluble copper oxide (CuO) powder. This is one of the required practicals for GCSE. The challenge was to use their knowledge of how crystals form in order to grow the biggest CuSO₄ crystal.

Marks are awarded for each class for best mini-bedsit, largest crystal and best photograph. The marks are added to a PTC League Table, which will continue over the year.

The winning class at the end of the academic year will receive an award, yet to be announced. Last year's winners (10y1) went on a trip to Thorpe Park in July.





X Lab for Phase One 'Christmas Sparkle'

The first X Lab of the academic year took place in December. Years 7 and 8 took part in four Science activities:



- 1. Students grew multi-coloured crystals on cardboard Christmas trees, demonstrating capillary action and chromatography
- 2. Students grew borax crystals on pipe cleaner tree decorations
- 3. Students suspended tinsel in the air using plastic rods or balloons, demonstrating electrostatic forces
- 4. Students made artificial snow people using baking powder









Join the STEM Club



The STEM Club meets every Monday after school in room R108.

It is open to Years 7 to 10. Currently the club are preparing for the LEGO League Competition that takes place at the end of this term.



LEGO League is a global STEM challenge for teams of young people, to encourage an interest in real world themes and develop key skills that are crucial for their future careers.

Young people work together to explore a given topic and to design, build and program an autonomous LEGO robot to solve a series of missions.





A Super Busy Term in the Brompton Academy Library

'What is it... and where does it belong?' The discovery of something mysterious and out of place is the starting point for this family show. The production is a musical reimagining of Shaun Tan's beautifully illustrated book about a boy who helps a lost thing find its way home. In this enchanting collaboration between Candoco Dance Company and The Royal Opera, a cast of disabled and non-disabled singers, dancers and musicians, come together to tell a story about how we are all connected.

This experience will help students with their upcoming choreography and devising assessments in addition to furthering their knowledge of arts practitioners and companies.





UKAT Sixth Form Students Visit the Turner Prize Exhibition at Turner Contemporary, Margate

Supported by the team at Turner Contemporary, UKAT Sixth Form students visited the gallery to see the work of three artists whose work had been shortlisted for the Turner Prize.

This was an incredible opportunity for the students to see a range of artworks in the incredible setting of the Turner Contemporary gallery in Margate.

The works explored themes such as identity, equality and human rights and featured a range of media such as sculptures and audio installations. Other pieces also featured in the gallery such as a stunning series of large charcoal works which had been drawn

directly on to the walls by the artist Barbara Walker.

Outside the gallery is an Anthony Gormley sculpture which is located in the sea; the silhouette of someone looking out into the water was very striking and characteristic of his work.

The trip was a chance for Art, Photography and Performing Arts students to see the work of a range of famous artists and to expand their cultural knowledge and understanding.

We hope to see the influence of this experience in the work they produce in the future.









Chatham Historic Dockyard Arts Award Project

In October half term a group of Year 9 and 10 Performing Arts students participated in a collaborative project between Brompton Academy, Chatham Historic Dockyard and Brolly Productions.

School of Rock Trip for UKAT students



Brompton Academy students planned a research topic, collected and recorded their data and created a poster detailing their findings. This term students will be also be invited to attend a Sports Science conference where they will present their posters to University of Kent lecturers, PhD students and special guests.





Exciting Outward Bounds Trip to Wales

This term, the PE department took twenty-four BTEC Sport students to the Outward Bound Centre in Aberdovey, Wales, for a residential trip.

The trip was aimed towards pushing students out of their comfort zones, realising the skills they possess and providing experiences and memories that students will remember for a lifetime.

Students had the opportunity to try out gorge walking, go on mountain expeditions, attempt high rope challenges and have a go at rock climbing. A Snapshot of Spanish at Brompton Academy

We have certainly been busy in Spanish this term.

Year 7 and 8 students are always excited to learn new songs, new vocabulary words, greetings and actively participate in all the planned activities to make Spanish accessible. As always, we are aiming for students to learn in a fun learning environment, so they feel confident speaking and learning Spanish.

We usually start our lessons with a kinaesthetic activity such as walk around the classroom where they greet each other, ask questions about the weather, the date, how they are feeling and every day conversations. We try to make the lessons dynamic with lots of movement in the classroom to keep students active and engaged in the lessons.



Students have started to learn basic grammar, such as verb and noun agreement, as well as conjugating verbs with ar, er, and ir endings. We are very impressed by how well the students can ask questions with the correct grammar forms in Spanish.

They have also learnt to give opinions about things they like and dislike doing, as well as talking about the weather and what they like doing when it's raining! They are presently learning 'un Villancico' (a Christmas Carol) in Spanish.

Recently we had the pleasure of taking thirty Year 9 students on a residential trip to Disneyland Paris. Everybody had a really good time and the students represented Brompton Academy immaculately throughout our four fun-filled, action-packed days.

News from the English Department

Not only did we want the students to have a book that was exclusively their own, but we wanted to generate some 'buzz' around these books. Staff came up with the idea that once the student had read their book, they pass it onto another student and so on and so forth. A Level English LiteratureWorkshop for Year 11 Students

Aware that it has been a year since our students studied or discussed English Literature in lessons, English teachers wanted to keep the flame burning bright, so this term we reached out to some of our Year 11 students and invited them to come along to 'pizza and prose'. We discussed some of the themes, ideas, motifs, contextual factors present in the opening chapter of Beloved - one of the prose texts we study for A-Level. Some great ideas were generated and we all left feeling both full of knowledge and full of pizza. We will meet again next term and discuss our findings from *The Yellow Wallpaper* by Charlotte Perkins Gillman and we are looking forward to it already!

Year 12 A-Level Workshops

This term we offered a workshop to facilitate the transition between studying English Literature at GCSE and English Literature at A Level.

We worked closely with Dr. Alex Martin-Carey at the University of Kent and UoK ambassadors, and devised a series of workshops for Year 12 students that would help bridge this gap and develop their confidence in dealing not only with the assessment objectives for the course, but to also raise students' confidence with some of the texts that we are currently studying like Beloved and A Streetcar Named Desire.

These workshops took place in Brompton Academy on Wednesday afternoons as part of academic mentoring. At our final session we asked for feedback from the students which was really positive. We hope to run more sessions like these in the year to come.
