All assemblies were extremely vibrant recognising students success and achievements, with many awards being given out this term.

REWARDS - EPRAISE SYSTEM

All students have access to the reward app called ePraise which is personalised for the Academy. The app is easily accessible and available to all students and staff. Within the ePraise system, students can view REACH points, achievement badges, leader boards, virtual certificates, timetables, their student bio, after school clubs, activities, raffle rewards and donations towards local charities.

Students can earn individual REACH points for personal efforts, and team points for competing and/or supporting the Academy community.

Staff reward students that demonstrate our Academy ethos: Resilience, Equality, Aspiration, Community and Happiness. Points are extremely valuable and are only distributed to students that staff feel have gone above and beyond in their learning.

Students can spend points on items from the Academy reward shop, enter raffles for larger termly items (such as Apple AirPods and this term a £100 Love to Shop voucher), or donate a proportion of their points to a cash value for charity. Students can also suggest other prizes and items too. Raffle prizes can be viewed on students iPads.



SAMUEL COLERIDGE TAYLOR

Born in London, Samuel was identified as a musical prodigy. He studied at the Royal College of Music and was a highly talented composer. He worked as the conductor for the main choir at Rochester Cathedral. He was the youngest delegate at the first Pan-African Congress in 1900.

SARAH FORBES BONETTA

Originally called Aina, she was born a Yoruba princess in Nigeria and later 'given as a gift' to Queen Victoria. The Queen was impressed by her charm and intellect. Living in Palm Cottage, Gillingham, she was taken as the Queen's adopted daughter and could be considered the first black person to join the British royal family.

SAMUEL CROWTHER

After being kidnapped by slavers, Samuel was raised in Sierra Leone where he joined the Church and became superb linguist and recorded 500 different language and dialects in the diverse nation. He moved to Gillingham and lived in Palm Cottage for health reasons and became the first Black bishop of the Church of England.

JAMES BROWN

In 1805 Brown enlisted as a volunteer on HMS Victory built in Chatham Dockyard. He was one of many Black crew members. Brown can be found on the pedestal of Nelson's Column where he is depicted in action taking aim at the Frenchman who shot Nelson.

The Careers Hub has had a good end to the year, with the Careers Business Networking Breakfast in December 2023, and visits from a number of professionals to talk to our students.

Our visitors for the December Careers Business Networking Breakfast were, a police inspector from Kent Police, a HR manager from the University of Kent Academies Trust, and the procurement manager for Medway NHS. This was another busy meeting with a mix of students from different year groups attending. The students were engaged with all the speakers, and asked some fantastic questions.



CAREER OF THE MONTH

Our Career of the Month for December is a design engineer. Each month, posters and information are displayed around the Academy, with information about different careers. The key skills required are highlighted, along with available apprenticeships and local job opportunities.

YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE

Our Year 10 students have finished selecting their placements for their work experience week, which is happening in January 2024. Students are looking forward to spending a week in the world of work engaging in different tasks, learning new skills, and meeting different people.

X LAB PROGRAMME

The Science Department dedicated its X Lab week to plastics, bioplastics, recycling and reusing plastic. Students in Years 7 to Year 10 made bioplastic out of potato starch and plastic bags to make something new. The best creations will win ten ePraise points.

Part of the X Lab Programme was researching career opportunities in chemistry, chemical engineering, the recycling industry, and new opportunities concerned with the environment using the Unifrog App.

All Year 7 students have created accounts and logged onto Unifrog. Students have used Unifrog to complete an Interest Profile quiz that then links their personality and interests to possible careers from Unifrog's Careers Library.

NEW YEAR 11 TEAMS CHANNEL

A new Teams channel has been created for our Year 11 students with links to a variety of local and national career and labour market information, which includes apprenticeships, college courses, sixth forms, and Higher Education. This is updated continually to ensure the information is relevant and accurate. In January 2024, we will be starting a new segment highlighting different opportunities available within the local job market each term.

UKAT GOVERNING BOARD UPDATE

We have had another busy start to the year for the UKAT Governing Boards. Governors have met twice already and continue to hold leaders to account.

PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT YEAR 7 TO YEAR 9 TALKS IN SCHOOLS AND YOUTH SETTINGS

Healthy Relationships, Online Harms, Online Safety and Cyberbullying



Last year, Kent Police initiated a survey to find out how safe women and girls felt around Kent. One of the most popular recommendations coming out of that, was to support early prevention education in schools and youth settings. Additionally, they ran another study asking young people how effective they found such intervention programmes and young people told them overwhelmingly, that they were worthwhile, and most had changed their behaviours as a result.

As part of Kent Police's early intervention programme, students in Year 7 to Year 9 participated in an interactive assembly run by Collaborate Digital. The aim was to support young people in having a healthy online life, whilst avoiding potential threats and dangers. The presentations were age appropriate and focused on healthy relationships, attitudes, behaviours and safety as well as online harms, online safety, and positive methods of communication.

CURRICULUM

This term, Year 7 to Year 11 students have been learning about careers and exploring their goals and aspirations for their future.

Year 7 students have also been exploring the factors that motivate people to work, developing their financial awareness, learning about the importance of saving and budgeting.

Year 8 students learnt about equality in the workplace, how our rights have changed over time and how our we are protected against discrimination through the Equality Act of 2010. They also learned how advertising techniques influence us as consumers.

In preparation for making their Key Stage 4 choices, Year 9 have been learning about different qualification levels. Students began by reflecting on their own skills and qualities to help them identify their personal strengths. They examined different sources for support and how to make informed decisions about their future.

Year 10 have been planning and receiving guidance and support for their work experience which will be taking place in January 2024. All students achieve a Certificate of Attendance, but the Excellence Award is given to those who have a particularly successful experience; who are identified by their employers and complete the written diary and evaluations. Finally, Year 11 students have been looking at their next steps and post-16 options. Students have looked at the advantages and disadvantages of different study pathways and where they can continue their education at school, at college, or through apprenticeships.

As part of their relationships education, Key Stage 4 students also learnt about key features of healthy and unhealthy relationships. Students learnt about sexual exploitation and how to recognise coercive and abusive behaviour.
