Re: Year 10 – Start of Year Information

I hope you and your families have had a good summer break and your child is refreshed and ready to go as they start Key Stage 4 and begin their exam journey over the next two years.

I am writing to share a number of key dates and information with you. I feel it is really important that we work closely together this year in order to ensure your child is well supported over the next two years as they start and complete their GCSE and BTEC qualifications.

Year 10 Information Evening

We will be holding a Year 10 Information Evening for both parents/carers and students on **Thursday 6th October.** This evening will provide an introduction to Year 10 and GCSE/BTEC qualifications as well as information and key dates for the year ahead.

The times for the sessions will be based on the band your child is in as follows:

- 4.30pm E Band
- 6pm M and S Bands

Year 10 Parent/Carer Consultation Evening

This year the parent/carer consultation evening will take place on **Thursday 20th April** and will run from 4.00pm to 7.00pm using the SchoolCloud system. This evening will be vitally important to discuss your child's progress with their teachers in each of their subject courses. Students should also attend these virtual evenings with you.

Key Stage 4 Bands

The bands which students are assigned to will change as they start Key Stage 4 and Year 10. Students are placed in bands for Year 10 and 11 based on their target and attainment grades in Key Stage 3. The Key Stage 4 bands are as follows: E band, M band and S band. Your child will find out their new band at the start of Year 10 when they receive their timetable next week. The core team and I will regularly review your child's progress and attainment during the course of this year and as



a result, band changes may be made throughout the year based on how your child is progressing. We will contact you to discuss this if your child needs to change their attainment band.

Personal Tutors

Your child will be allocated a Year 10 Personal Tutor when they return to the Academy next week. Year 10 Personal Tutors are part of a specialist team who have had additional training to support your child in Year 10 and will be working closely with the core team throughout the year. Your child will have a 30-minute session on their timetable with their Personal Tutor daily and this member of staff will therefore be their and your first point of contact for any questions or support.

Study Skill Sessions and Tutoring

During the course of this year, all Year 10 students will take part in a number of study skills workshops. These workshops are designed to boost revision skills, provide additional support and guidance to aid successful studying, whilst also developing students' ownership of learning. The details of these workshop sessions will be shared with students in Term 1.

Tutoring in English and Maths will take place during the year with specific students in order to provide targeted students with additional bespoke support. Students will be notified directly of these sessions by Ms Smith and the Tutoring Team.

Behaviour and Attendance

I would like to take this opportunity to reiterate the importance for exceptionally high standards of both behaviour and attendance in Year 10. The majority of students meet the standards of behaviour expected as part of the Academy's Code of Conduct. However, should a student fail to meet these expectations, this will be challenged and followed up to ensure the learning of other students is not affected. Additionally, excellent levels of attendance and punctuality to school and lessons are key factors in ensuring your child is able to maximise their learning and progress during



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the next two years. I would be grateful if you would reinforce this and support your child in order to ensure they make the most of all of their learning time during Year 10.

GCSE Mock Exam and Assessment Dates

Mock exams and in class assessments are planned in order to start to prepare students for the GCSE exams at the end of Year 11 and ensure that you, your child and their teachers are aware of their strengths and areas for improvement.

- End of Year Mock exam window Monday 26th to Friday 30th June

Work Experience

All Year 10 students will take part in a Work Experience placement for a week, which will take place Monday 30th January to Friday 3rd February 2023. This week is an excellent opportunity for students to gain an experience of the working world outside of the academy. A letter with full information will follow in the coming weeks.
