The Rights Respecting Schools Award

We are pleased to announce that through the hard work of the Academy's Student Parliament, Brompton Academy has achieved the Bronze (first step) of The Rights Respecting Schools Award. This involved a whole-school review of our practices, which incorporated student and staff practices and perspectives. The Student Parliament then had to devise an action plan to address our main areas for development, which is now being implemented as part of our work towards the Silver Award.

The Rights Respecting Schools Award recognises achievement in putting the UN Convention on the Right of the Child (CRC) at the heart of a school's practice to improve wellbeing and help all children and young people realise their potential. The Award is based on the principles of equality, dignity, respect, non-discrimination and participation.

Woolf Mini School Christmas Stalls

All students from the Woolf Mini School have been working together to raise funds for 'The Laurence Plummer Foundation', a Medway based charity.

During Mini School tutor time (MST), students were extremely focused on the various activities to prepare them for the Christmas market. Each tutor group organised one stall each (a total of 11 stalls) within the refectory.

The project included the following topics to focus on in the build-up to the event:

- Fundraiser, steps to take and budgeting to make a profit
- Establishing your ideas for raising funds (one stall per tutor group)
- Decide on your stall and individual fundraiser
- Allocation of roles and responsibilities to members in your group
- Budget for costing and make orders for the stalls
- Stall and fundraiser preparation design, create, advertise, posters, etc
- The event Thursday 16th December Christmas Market (12pm 2pm across all four lunches)

Students have learnt many valuable skills on this journey:

- Gratification
- Leadership
- Teamwork
- Resilience
- Financial skills
- Entrepreneurial (business skills)

The event was a huge success and raised over £470 in profit! Well done to all the students and thank you to all the students who supported the event!

Other fundraisers included the Woolf Mini School Ambassador James, who raised a total of £330 with his own challenge. James' challenge was to run one mile, on the hour, every hour, for 24 hours. This





meant James had to stay awake for 24 hours. James smashed his challenge with his quickest mile being 6 minutes, 45 seconds! Very well done James!

Mr Denness' 50km Ultramarathon

On the 11th December, Mr Denness (Associate Vice Principal), ran a 50km (31 miles) ultramarathon to support the Woolf Mini School charity funding team.

All Woolf Mini School teams worked really hard to raise money for a local charity called 'The Laurence Plummer Foundation'. The charity aims to help disadvantaged young people get into sport. They offer resources, support, and opportunities to the under privileged youth in our community.

Students in the Woolf Mini School organised their own individual fundraisers and worked as a team to have their own Christmas stalls. These were set up in the refectory on Thursday 16th December.

Mr Denness' challenged was inspired by his grandfather who passed away of COVID-19 on the 15th December; a four-time Olympian and Great British silver medalist in race walking - 50km being his best achievement. Laurence Plummer also died of COVID-19 and also inspired Mr Denness when he played for Hollands and Blair FC. Both his grandfather and 'Plum' always supported disadvantaged children and getting them into sport.

To prepare for his huge challenge, Mr Denness has completed 11 weeks of training, clocked over 230 miles and had a record run of 21 miles (3 hours 8 minutes).




NHS Careers Information

Access to Higher Education Diploma and GCSE

Do you want to develop your learning skills or return to learning after a break? Would you like to enjoy learning in a supportive atmosphere, and are keen to gain a valuable qualification? If the answer to any of these is 'yes' then the University of Kent's Access to Higher Education Diploma, together with the GCSE Maths and English courses, could be suitable for you.

The Access to Higher Education Diploma is designed for adults and focuses on coursework and discussion. Helpful University of Kent tutors, regular guidance and inspiring sessions, are designed to help you reach your full potential.

You can study a range of subjects, including Psychology, Creative Writing, Sociology, Politics with Law, and English Literature. You can also gain skills in research, essay-writing and presentations, and you can even get GCSEs in English and Maths.

The part-time Diploma course will be offered at Chatham Grammar from September and you are required to take at least three subject modules, which will be spread over two years to complete the qualification.
